Good Problem

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
John 1:5

We hope you had a wonderful Christmas season and a blessed New Year. We would like to thank you for your support. It has been a year of challenges, yet God shines through it all.

The gang activity and battles for control make it impossible to travel to Haiti. We continue to manage the ministry from here in the States. God has blessed us with wonderful in-country co-laborers with whom we work to keep the ministries moving forward.

On November 1, we hosted our annual fundraising banquet, attended by many. We wish to thank everyone who attended, who are praying, and who donated to the ongoing ministries of Juniper. We are a seven-day-a-week ministry, and that requires finances. Thank you so much for providing towards those needs.

On November 7, we were able to bless the churches with 22,000 pounds of food to be distributed to their congregations. This was a huge blessing to them as food is not only scarce but also very expensive.



Sadly, with the lack of rain and harsh Haitian sun, the peanuts that were planted have been destroyed by drought. In the interim, we will plant a large number of fruit-bearing trees that can be hand-watered.

This will not only provide additional fresh fruit but also additional shade for the gardens. It saddens us that this potential crop was destroyed, but we will keep moving forward.



Years ago, we began a ministry called Bible Club. It is a ministry where the children meet once a week to receive a good hot meal and learn God's word.

We currently support 10 Bible Clubs. It is a blessing to know that many, many children are learning God's word and ways each week.

Our original intent was to reach the children. God has since turned it into an extremely effective church-planting apparatus.



In a previous newsletter, we told you that in March, we began a Bible club in the village of Matthieu. They invited children from the village to come, and some came the first week. The next week, more came. That trend continued for several weeks. It became apparent that we needed to construct a shelter to meet in. We constructed a temporary structure on rented land in June, and benches were built.

The number of children again increased, and at the end of June, we funded revival services in that village.

July brought VBS, and on July 13, the first church service was held. Local people brought chairs from their homes to sit in. More benches were built.





On August 13, we received a request for more benches as both the Bible club and the church were growing, so we provided more benches. On December 21, we received a message that said “no place for people”.

At the last service, people were standing outside as the temporary Church is too small to hold everyone.

We have a “good problem”.

It is obvious we will need to expand the temporary church. Please join us in praying for clarity that God will show us the next steps. This church is right next to a large voodoo temple and is less like a lamp on a table and more like a lighthouse to the lost.

God is good.
