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Yes or No

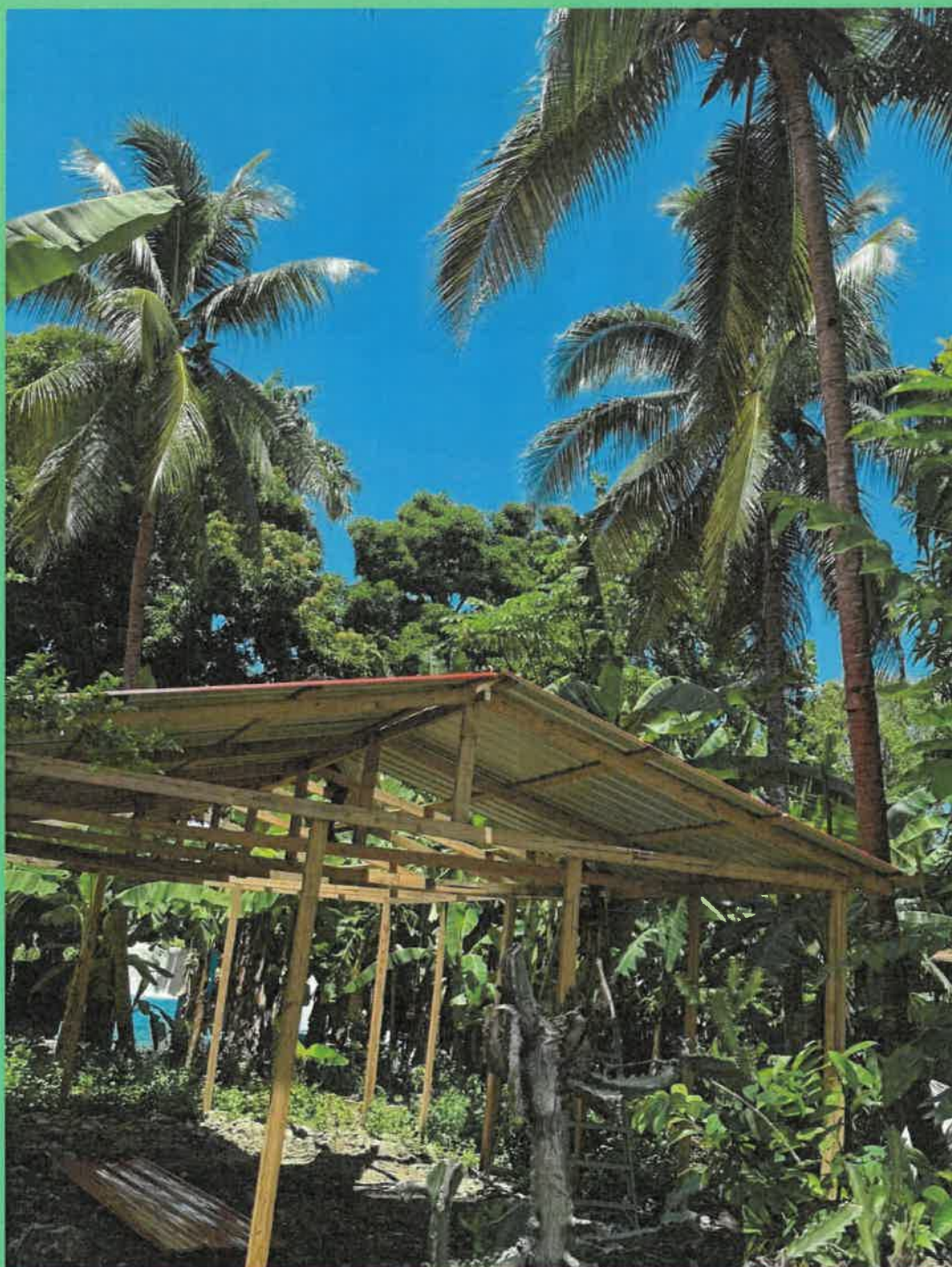
*Jesus said, "Let the little children come unto me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."

Sometimes it is difficult to decide which outreach or need we should financially support. The needs in Haiti can become overwhelming. Only through guidance from the Holy Spirit is it possible.

On my first mission trip to Haiti, I was blessed to be the driver for the head missionary. I spent the week asking questions, tossing out ideas, and one day on the drive back, he told me something I will never forget. After fielding question after question, he made a simple statement that will stick with me forever. He said, "George, sometimes you have to say no so that you can say yes." Now I have to confess that at the time I thought that was

a pretty hollow statement, but as God drew us to serving Him through missions, I finally understood it and the power in that statement.

Saying no or not yet is one of the most difficult things in ministry in Haiti. Each need that comes deserves consideration. Each of these needs is important to the person or the Church that is asking. God continues to bless Juniper, but sometimes, many times, we have to say “no” or “not yet.” It is heartbreaking to be the deliverer of that response, but sometimes “we have to say no so that we can say yes.” Here is a yes!



In our last newsletter, we shared that we were constructing a temporary building at Kafou Kwa for the growing Bible club. In April, it was completed. They held a revival service, which also began regular church services. At the revival service, 13 children gave their lives to Christ.

In May, Marantha Church sent us photos of the baptism of new believers.



We were blessed to send funds to celebrate Matthieu's first anniversary as a church. In conjunction, they will hold a revival service, and we are praying

for the lost to find Christ. There are new baptisms in Jubot and new believers throughout the churches. This year, we sent funds for VBS at 10 churches.

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me." God is moving in the churches in Haiti. Thank you for helping us say "yes!"

So, with new believers, discipleship is a growing need. We continue to fund a Bible class that invites people from the community and other churches to come to class and deepen their biblical knowledge. It is a Bible school of sorts that they can attend for free. Our hope is for their spiritual roots to grow before the storms of life come. Please join us in praying for that.

In the gardens, the fruit trees are growing well and are being tended. At the request of the gardeners, we are giving the vegetable gardens a rest this year and will be replanting next year. We will continue to focus on the existing fruit trees and plant additional ones.





It is always difficult to source quality tools in Haiti. Our construction came to a halt as our welder's welder gave up. He was able to find another one in Haiti. With your help, we were able to purchase it, and he is back at work. He is finishing up the roof and window bars as well as the steel door to complete the current home.



The 10 Bible clubs continue to reach into the family lives through the children. The hot, nutritious meal they are served is why many families send their kids. What they return home with is a full belly, a heart filled with Christ, and a mind filled with scripture.
